
Second Harvest received a donation of over 10,000 pounds of Corn Flakes. Thanks to all our volunteer groups who helped package it for distribution.

We would like to extend the warmest THANK YOU to all who made the holiday season a little brighter for our friends and neighbors in the Mahoning Valley. Food insecurity isn't seasonal, it can be an everyday occurrence for once-stable individuals and families, senior citizens on limited incomes and some facing medical hardships or unexpected repair bills. Often, the food budget is the first thing people try to adjust. Our network of 160 partners is a lifeline that means the difference between going hungry and having a nutritious meal.

Over 10.5 million pounds of food was distributed in 2023, including over 2.4 million pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables. That is one million more pounds than in 2022, sadly exhibiting the need for food assistance is not decreasing. A staggering average of 18,000 people were helped each week in our tri-county area, with 29% of that number being children and 25% seniors.

In this edition of our quarterly newsletter, you will see more statistics from the impact we all made together during 2023. You'll see how huge packages of unboxed, unbagged cereal are processed by several groups of volunteers on page 5. An exciting announcement about a new school pantry is on page 4. New School Pantry at Hubbard High School

Students in the Hubbard School District now have access to an on-site food pantry. The project was started by the Cody A. Pitts Foundation which donated \$5,000 to address food insecurity among students.

The district will partner with Second Harvest Food Bank to buy food at discounted rates, ensuring the pantry remains well-stocked. Students will be able to utilize the pantry to grab a snack throughout the day or bring food home, even over the weekends. The pantry will also let students work inside, giving them a chance to learn life skills.

VOLUNTEER GROUPS

Imagine walking into the Food Bank's warehouse and seeing several six-feet tall, wrapped bales of cereal! Second Harvest received a donation of 10,693 pounds of Corn Flakes. Each bale is opened carefully and poured into a smaller lined tote to scoop into a labeled, heat sealed, 16-ounce bag and placed in a box holding 16 bags. The boxes are taped and ready to go out to our partners to distribute. This was quite an under-taking and we are grateful not only to our regular, weekly volunteers, but to our volunteer groups that came in to lend a hand.
